His work is hard and very physical as he is unloading trucks of produce, usually working the night shifts. He was recognized as employee of the month recently and is enjoying getting to know his co-workers. He took an online English class for the first half of the year and did very well on the final exam.

He got his drivers permit in October and is in the process of learning to drive, with the hopes of getting his driver's license in the first part of 2024. One of the highlights of the year for Jeremiah was cooking a traditional African meal for over 100 PADS clients. With the help of MFC members and a big assist from James Lang, he shopped, cooked and served a delicious meal and the clients ate every bit of food he cooked.
