Communion Bread Ingredients: Water, sourdough (rice flour), Rice starch, cornstarch, modified cellulose, caramelized sugar syrup, psyllium, seed husk, sunflower oil, pea protein, yeast, millet flour, citrus fiber, rice flour, quinoa flour, salt, quar qum, corn flour, rice syrup. May contain: Sesame.

2) Deposit a check in the offering plate during service OR send in a check. If some/all of your donation is for The Boulevard, please tell us the split in the memo line or in a separate note. If all of your gift is intended solely for UCH, just send the check.
