

# MEET OUR GUEST PREACHER DR. BRAD R. BRAXTON

Dr. Brad Braxton serves as the President and Professor of Public Theology at Chicago Theological Seminary, a progressive graduate school renowned for its leadership in social justice and interfaith engagement. Since 2011, he has also been the Founding Senior Pastor of The Open Church. This inclusive congregation is dedicated to social activism, LGBTQ+ equality, and interfaith collaboration. Although The Open Church primarily gathers online, it maintains strong ties to Baltimore, Maryland, where it was originally founded.

Dr. Braxton holds a Ph.D. in New Testament studies from Emory University, where he was a George W. Woodruff Fellow, a master's degree in theology from the University of Oxford, where he was a Rhodes Scholar, and a B.A. in religious studies from the University of Virginia, where he was a Jefferson Scholar and a member of Phi Beta Kappa.



Dr. Braxton is the author of five scholarly books exploring the intersection of religion

and social justice. His two most recent books, published in 2023, are *Open: Unorthodox Thoughts on God and Community*, a collection of his essays and sermons examining religion from a progressive perspective, and *A Master Class on Being Human: A Black Christian and A Black Secular Humanist on Religion, Race, and Justice*, co-authored with noted secular humanist Dr. Anthony Pinn. This book explores the differences and similarities between black religious and black secular communities in the ongoing struggle for social justice. Additionally, Dr. Braxton's books *No Longer Slaves: Galatians and African American Experience* and *Preaching Paul* are frequently used in seminary courses.

Dr. Braxton is also a seasoned educator who has held professorships at Southern Methodist University, Vanderbilt University, and Wake Forest University, as well as lectureships at Georgetown University, Harvard Divinity School, and McCormick Theological Seminary. His leadership extends beyond academia into cultural, philanthropic, and religious organizations. He formerly served as the Director of the Center for the Study of African American Religious Life at the Smithsonian National Museum of African American History and Culture in Washington, DC, the Program Officer for Religion in the Public Sphere at the Ford Foundation in New York City, the Senior Minister of the Riverside Church in New York City, and the Senior Pastor of Douglas Memorial Community Church in Baltimore, Maryland.

Dr. Braxton is an ordained Baptist minister and a highly sought-after lecturer and preacher. In 2007, he preached at Westminster Abbey in London, England, where his sermon on justice and non-violence was part of the bicentennial commemoration of the abolition of the slave trade in the British Empire. He has also preached and lectured in Benin, Canada, Ghana, and South Africa.
