



A wonderful group of members have committed themselves to the important task of searching for our new Senior Minister. Keep them and their work in your prayers. This is an exciting time for Union Church!




**Trayce Biancalana** I have been blessed to serve on various ministries at our church, with my favorite being Ministry for Change.


